## **1. ELIGIBILITY**

**\*\*New\*\***

**Q1:** Regarding mandatory participation of early-career researchers, the proposed PI is an Assistant Professor who submitted their PhD thesis within the last five years. The same would hold for the partner in France. Are both considered to be early-career researchers?

**Q2:** Just a quick query in regards Early Career Researcher eligibility for the Ulysses, if someone is in a lecturer role but still within the 5-year post-PhD window, would they still be eligible to count as an Early Career Researcher for this call? From the Campus France definition it seems pretty straight forward that all researchers within this 5-year time frame would count, but in the Research Ireland guidance it seems to say specifically postgrad and postdoc researchers.

**A:** An Assistant Professor or researcher with a lecturing role (i.e. a lecturer's contract) at their institution, would not qualify as an early career researcher on the Irish side, even if they have submitted their PhD thesis within the last 5 years.

As per the Call Document, *“an early career researcher is defined as a current PhD student, or a postdoctoral researcher who has submitted their PhD thesis within the last 5 years”*.

For queries relating to the eligibility of the French partner, and whether or not they can be considered an early career researcher or “jeune chercheur”, contact should be made with Campus France.

**\*\*New\*\***

**Q:** One of our PIs is very keen on submitting their application to Ulysses 2026 call. They currently have a postdoc with a contract ending in January 2026. Can this postdoc be a part of the application? We notice that the call document states that applicants must have contracts that will cover the two-year period of the award. But normally postdoctoral fellowships are only for two years. So, even if the postdoc starts during the application period, they will not have contract until the end of the two-year award period. Would you be able to kindly suggest if our understanding is correct?

**A:** The applicant / Principal Investigator on the Ulysses award needs to have a contract that covers the duration of the award. However, team members may be in place for some, or all, of the award. It would be expected that an Early Career Researcher would have an active role for the majority of the project.

## 3. CONDITIONS OF AWARD

**\*\*New\*\***

**Q:** The Ulysses 2026 funds can be used until December 2027; can funds be used to involve new people in the project at a later stage (e.g., future PhD students or last-year Master students) and use the funds to cover travel expenses for visiting periods? *For example, hosting a student from ENS Lyon for a 3-month internship for his master's dissertation.* Can Ulysses funds could be used to finance future internships? We do not know who the students will be next year, but there will be some interest.

**A:** No, the proposed budget plan in the application form should cover the costs for the period of January 1<sup>st</sup> 2026 – 31<sup>st</sup> of December 2027. Funds can not be used at a later stage.
